Each year we have visitor from around the area come and share his or her story with our athletes. We were fortunate to have a very inspirational visitor come to Camp Abilities 2013. John Robinson is a congenital quad-amputee, which means he has no arms past his elbows and no legs past his knees. His company, Our Ability, Inc. has organized a 350 mile "Journey Along the Erie Canal" this summer to raise awareness of the "ability inside all people with disabilities". In addition to biking, boating and walking from Buffalo to Albany in order to raise funds to support adaptive sports, accessibility, education and employment for New Yorkers with Disabilities, he and others give informational and inspirational talks to raise awareness. Journey Along the Erie Canal is a visual symbol showing that people with disabilities are capable and the world needs to see and understand. It just so happens that the canal goes through Brockport! Dr. Lieberman heard of John's story and reached out to him, asking if he wanted to stop to see Camp Abilities and talk to our campers. He eagerly accepted



and stopped by Camp. The "main point of his message to the campers was that many times opportunities are disguised at challenges".
